Benton Stokes, guest artist

Ever since he could barely reach his grandmother's piano on his tiptoes, Benton Stokes has been making up melodies. He was influenced an early age by Elton John, Billy Joel, lots of Motown, and whatever was on the radio as a kid. He started playing coffeehouses in his hometown of Nashville as a teen. After college, he landed



a successful career in Christian music, with songs recorded by Point Of Grace, Kathy Troccoli, Scott Krippayne, and Sandi Patty, among others. (Google: Kevin Stokes).

Before too long, he decided it was time to begin sharing his songs in his own voice. His albums, Grace & Gravity (2007) and Turn Off The Moon (2015), are collections of hopeful, pianocentric pop songs that share his perspectives and his story. In 2020, after a move to San Jose, Benton released Love Is The Way Back Home, a 5-song EP he produced himself from his living room. Including the singles "Sacred," "Cry Sometimes," and the title cut, Love Is The Way Back Home points to how the Divine shows up in ordinary places and how love wins, even when life is hard.
